## Reading BrightStart! Complete Program for Early Literacy Success: Level One Curriculum and Implementation Training

### **Course Description**

In an effort to close the achievement gap, Reading BrightStart! The Complete Program for Early Literacy Success: Level One was developed to individualize early literacy instruction during the preschool years. This interactive training explores the developmentally appropriate instructional practices and effective teaching strategies that move diverse young learners toward reading readiness. The completion of the course will support educators as they adopt the instructional practices of the Reading BrightStart! program. Each graduate of this course will have the skills needed to implement with success, ensure program fidelity, and evaluate student outcomes within their classroom.

#### Outcomes

The outcomes of this session are met through a combination of face-to-face\* lecture, interactive demonstration, and small group assignments. Upon completion, participants will:

- Possess a basic knowledge and understanding of the Reading BrightStart!, Complete Program for Early Literacy Success: Level One, and how to implement the curriculum with success in their classroom,
- Identify research-based, best practices in early literacy instruction for at-risk preschoolers,
- Acquire practice of delivery methods using kit materials and lesson plans to provide early literacy activities,
- Demonstrate an understanding of modifications used within the program to adapt for individualized instruction.

### Day One: RBS! Instructional Practices (7 Hours with lunch break)

Day One will examine and explore the foundational literacy skills and educational elements that make up the foundation of Reading BrightStart! The Complete Program for Early Literacy Success: Level One curriculum. To ensure educators will effectively incorporate early literacy into daily instruction, participants will learn to support the acquisition of these concepts. After completing this session, participants will be able to:

- Recognize the effective, research-based, and developmentally appropriate critical elements in the framework of the RBS! instructional program,
- Understand the research findings and statistics that support the instructional practices recommended for the RBS! program,
- Deliver supportive dialogue and multisensory instructional strategies using kit materials,
- Determine when and how to make modifications to lesson delivery and,
- Understand common delivery challenges and provided areas of support.

# OPTIONAL Day Two: Program Implementation and Fluent Delivery (3 hours)

This session will effectively and efficiently guide participants through the implementation and evaluation process. To ensure the sustainability of Reading BrightStart! The Complete Program for Early Literacy Success: Level One, participants will examine customized options for scheduling instruction across multiple settings and diverse classrooms. In addition, data collection procedures to assess child outcomes will be presented. After completing this session, participants will be able to:

- Recognize the tools available to implement and assess lesson delivery, scheduling, and evaluation,
- Construct individualized scheduling options and implementation plans that contribute to optimal child performance,
- Facilitate communication and planning to achieve desired results and,
- Identify factors that include fluent delivery of instruction.

Additionally, participants will have opportunities to practice delivering lessons in small groups and preparing lesson materials to teach in their classroom. Hands-on practice will ensure that educators leave the training comfortable and ready to implement lessons.
